THE MIDATLANTIC AIDS EDUCATION AND TRAINING CENTER

The **MAAETC Preceptorship Clinical Scholars Program** offers a new, intensive, and experiential learning opportunity that integrates traditional didactic education, case-based learning, and evidence-based clinical practice.

Program Highlights

- **Training content** tailored to address the educational needs of healthcare professionals in Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, Delaware, and the District of Columbia.
- Hands-on clinical HIV **skills building** with expert faculty mentors.
- Ongoing **technical assistance** and tailored training to address continuing learning needs.
- A variety of **continuing education units (CEUs)** will be provided:
 - Continuing Medical Education (CME)
 - Continuing Nursing Education (CNE)
 - Continuing Pharmacy Education (CPE)

Program Components

- **Didactic 2-Day Session:** This component is offered twice a year and can accommodate up to 50 trainees each time.
- **Experiential On-Site Learning with Preceptors:** Each MAAETC Local Partner Site will host this component, coordinating learning experiences with appropriate clinical preceptors.
- **Clinical Content:** The educational topics covered will include, but are not limited to:
 - Routine screening; diagnosis; the initial patient encounter
 - ART prescribing; resistance testing; medication optimization; adherence
 - HIV and co-occurring STIs, Mpox, and viral hepatitis
 - Prevention strategies, including PrEP/PEP
 - Comorbidities; chronic disease management; primary care; immunizations
 - Co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders; motivational interviewing
