

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

According to the CDC, more than 36.9 million people are living with HIV worldwide. Recent scientific breakthroughs as well as various prevention efforts now point to the possibility of an AIDS Free generation. The World AIDS Day 2016 conference will bring together experts in the field of HIV in order to enable physicians, nurses and other HIV care providers to develop skills to identify and effectively treat those individuals diagnosed with HIV. Experts will discuss prevention, risk reduction and treatment and the potential for getting to zero new HIV infections, and much more.

Upon completion of this program, participants will be able to:

- Discuss activities of AIDS Free Pittsburgh including HIV, STI and Hepatitis data in Allegheny County
- Outline approaches to integrating HIV testing in primary care
- Discuss prevention, screening, management, and best practices of common chronic co-morbidities seen in the growing HIV population
- Discuss current models for engagement of MSM in HIV prevention and treatment
- Discuss approaches and best practices for providing culturally competent care for MSM
- Identify key aspects of the HIV treatment cascade and methods to incorporate HIV prevention into care
- Describe effective prevention and treatment approaches across the lifespan
- Discuss approaches to reducing barriers to care across the lifespan
- Describe the rationale and access to PrEP, including navigators, online directories, and educational materials
- Discuss overview of opioid epidemic in Pennsylvania and implication for primary care and HIV providers
- Identify successful strategies and models for intervention
- Discuss role of motivational interviewing in working with substance users
- Describe key elements of cultural competent primary and HIV care for transgender clients
- Discuss HIV clinical treatment considerations for transgender clients
