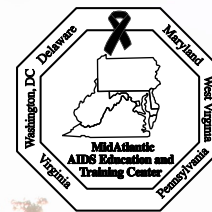

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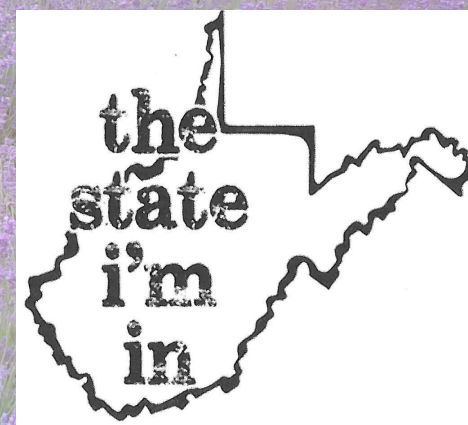

## Program Description

This 13th Annual Ryan White grantees conference intends to inform healthcare professionals on issues relative to the Primary Care of HIV infected persons who are at risk for acquiring HIV in WV. The conference offers a dynamic course agenda with expert faculty, speaking on clinically and socially relevant issues of HIV.

This conference also offers WV healthcare professionals the opportunity to link with other agencies across the state in order to enhance the provision of primary health care for those living with HIV and to step up improved patient outcomes for the HIV positive individual.

## Target Audience

Physicians, physician assistants, dentists, pharmacists, nurses, advanced practice nurses, social work and ancillary team members.

**Program Objectives:** *At the end of this program, participants should be able to:*

1. Identify the presentation and stages of LGV, the symptoms associated with dependent upon the area infected, those who may be at risk for acquisition and common prevention approaches.
2. Describe the importance of the provision of primary care for HIV positive individuals by primary care certified specialists.
3. Discuss the pharmacist-based HIV Chronic Care Model in terms of its ability to provide patient centered care and maximize desired health outcomes
4. Discuss the public health rationale for routine screening of HIV infection and implications for identification and treatment of co-occurring disorders.
5. Describe the retail pharmacist's role in monitoring anti-retroviral therapy adherence levels and collaborating with other HIV care providers to facilitate continuity of care.
6. Describe various modalities that are an important part of a comprehensive approach to reducing the transmission of viral and bacterial infections associated with injection drug use.
