“Prevention and Reproductive Choices for Women”

Conference Description: This virtual conference will focus solely on HIV and Women. According to CDC data more than 7,100 women received an HIV diagnosis in 2018. African American women are disproportionately affected by HIV, compared with women of other races/ethnicities. Conference attendees will gain knowledge of issues related to women living with HIV and women without HIV as well as issues related to birth control using a shared decision making model.

Target Audience: The intended audience for these webinars are physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, advance practice nurses, social work and ancillary team members.
